Niigata Prefectural Botanical Garden opened in December 1998. This expansive garden, 19.8 hectares in area, is home to more than 100,000 plants of brilliant color in all four seasons, and is a popular spot for the prefecture's residents to relax.

Akiha Ward, Niigata City, in which the Botanical Garden is located, is one of Japan's most renowned production areas for potted trees and shrubs. Niigata Prefecture also boasts a rich natural environment with approximately 3,000 native plant species.
